## 89. PLANNING MATTERS

Application No: 21/504571/FULL Proposal: Demolition of existing property and erection of 2no. five bedroom dwellings with associated parking and private amenity space as amended by drawing no's. 21.29\_PL\_11 Rev A; 21.29\_PL\_12 Rev B; 21.29\_PL13 Rev B; 21.29\_PL14 Rev A and 21.29\_PL\_20. Location: Greystone Bannister Hill Borden ME9 8HU

It was **RESOLVED** that Borden Parish Council objects to this planning application for the following reasons:

- a) The proximity of these two new large dwellings on adjoining properties in Bannister Hill and Hearts Delight Road is detrimental to their living environment. These new properties impact would be significant because of their raised elevation overlook the existing properties.
- b) The lack of adequate sight lines and the density and speed of traffic in Bannister Hill, which has increase significantly since 1981 when an application was refused on the basis of a Highway objection, means that traffic from this development will increase the risk of accidents to all road users including pedestrians.
- c) The increase of rainwater runoff from these properties will exacerbate the current draining problems at the bottom of Bannister Hill.
- d) The demolition of one property will impact heavily on the carbon footprint in this area. As will the subsequent build of the two new properties.
- e) There has been no consideration of the existing wildlife at this location. The detrimental impact that this site will have on the known badger population that exists on this site will be
